Adults at risk

" Any adult who is vulnerable because of mental disorder, learning difficulties, physical and/or sensory impairment, other impairment or older age and who is unable to care for him or herself or unable to protect him or herself against significant harm or exploitation "

Adults at risk

- Have a need for care and support
- Are experiencing (or are at risk of) abuse or neglect
- As a result of those care and support needs, they are unable to protect themselves





Self-neglect

- Unable or unwilling to provide adequate care for themselves
- Unable or unwilling to obtain necessary care to meet their needs
- Declining essential support without which their health and safety needs cannot be met





Adult abuse

" It may be physical, verbal or psychological, it may be an act of neglect or an omission to act, or it may occur when a vulnerable person is persuaded to enter into a financial or sexual transaction to which he or she has not consented, or cannot consent. Abuse can occur in any relationship "

Adult abuse

- Physical
- Sexual
- Emotional or psychological
- Neglect
- Financial or material
- Institutional
- Discriminatory

What stops adults from telling us they have been abused?





Child abuse and neglect

- Maltreatment
- Can involve inflicting harm or failing to act to prevent harm
- May be abused in a family, institutional or communal setting
- Perpetrator may be someone they know or a complete stranger





Child abuse and neglect

- Physical abuse
- Emotional abuse
- Sexual abuse
- Neglect
- Child sexual exploitation
- Female genital mutilation
- Trafficking and slavery





Children with disabilities

- Social isolation
- Dependency (help and intimate personal care)
- Impaired capacity to resist / avoid abuse
- Disclosure may be a lot more difficult
- May be more vulnerable to bullying / intimidation





Child sexual exploitation

From a child's perspective:

"Someone taking advantage of you sexually, for their own benefit. Through threats, bribes, violence, humiliation, or simply by telling you that they love you, they will have the power to get you to do sexual things for their own, or other people's, benefit or enjoyment ..."

- An operator will take details of the problem and your contact details, and then pass this information to the duty social worker
