Training of all existing staff and new members of the team so they are aware of the premises license and the importance of promoting the 4 licensing objectives. This will include, but is not limited to, monitoring the supply of alcohol, ensuring staff are adopting the "think 25" practise and refusal to serve to intoxicated visitors. No violence or threatening behavior in or around the premises. Ensuring the illegal use of drugs is prohibited in or around the premises, notifying the police in the event that this was to ever happen. Manager of the site is in day to day control of the premises & appropriate training is provided across all staff. CCTV is in operation 24/7 with play back option available. The safety of our customers and the area of which we are located is of utmost importance to all employees at Jimmy's, we understand the importance of promoting the 4 licensing objectives together. On previous submission of an application to vary an existing premises license, we have received some advice from the licensing authority which we are already taking steps to put in place.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

Jimmy's have security on the doors when there's events on at the weekend, dependent on the expected number of people, will have an impact of the number of security on site. Security remain on site until the premises is closed. We have CCTV 24/7 with live footage of all areas of the inside and outside of the building being shown behind the bar and on the owners phone. A play back option is available. Pool tables are covered and pool cues, darts and air hockey pucks are placed behind the bar during evenings. All items which could potentially be used as weapons are removed when events are on. Clear notices warning of potential criminal activity being reported to the police and will not be tolerated are displayed around

the building.

c) Public safety

Jimmy's Sports Bar complies with full standard statutory fire safety controls. All equipment within the building has regular safety maintenance checks with a log book kept on site with this information in.

We are at full capacity when we have 180 people in. To prevent overcrowding, at all events we expect to have over 100 people, we ensure we have security on the door with a click counter, stopping people from entering when we reach 180. Internal and external lighting is available with CCTV also monitoring internally & externally. There are signs located around the building clearly informing all customers that CCTV is in operation. All staff are trained in checking identification to prevent underage drinking.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Once licensed hours are over all customers will have to leave the premises. Clear notices are displayed at the exit asking customers to exit quietly to respect nearby residents. All staff who leave at the end of the night are aware of the importance of leaving the premises quietly so as to not disturb nearby residents. All deliveries take place during the day time. Bins are emptied at mid day in the afternoon, no bottle bins will be emptied past 10pm in the evening.

e) The protection of children from harm

Children are only allowed on the premises until 9pm & they must be with someone over the age of 18. All staff are trained in checking identification, adopting the think 25 practise, with clear signs in the bar areas, only accepting passports, driving licenses or citizen cards. We also have UV lights available to identify fake identification which may be used. In the event of this happening staff are aware they must confiscate this identification and report to the police. Gambling machines are monitored to ensure the age restriction is adhered to.
