STANDARDS BOARD UPDATE

Recommendation(s)

1. That the Report be noted

1. GENERAL

Bulletin 27 has previously been circulated at the time of writing this report. Any further updates received will be distributed and reported on verbally to the Committee.

2. ENHANCED PROFILE OF THE STANDARDS COMMITTEE

It is intended, following the consultation on the Code of Conduct that Standards Committees will become more involved in the ethical framework decision-making process, one of the proposals is to adopt a "local filter" approach to complaints, it is seen as the most appropriate way of addressing local issues and ensuring local ownership of standards.

3. ROLE OF STANDARDS BOARDS

The Standards Board will continue in a central role:

- championing and providing high standards of conduct
- developing the strategic functions of providing guidance and support to local authorities including appropriate sanctions for local determinations
- Developing resources to help with training
- Developing a training framework

- Setting standards for Monitoring Officers and Standards Committees
- Supporting authorities with ongoing self assessments
- Overseeing the "local decision making process" to ensure consistency and quality of the process; and
- · Retaining an investigative role for serious cases referred by Standards Committee

4. PERSONAL AND PREJUDICIAL INTERESTS

It is expected that there will be significant changes in this area, such as allowing members with prejudicial interests which arise through membership of other public bodies to speak (but not vote) in certain circumstances.

5. **STATISTICS**

The latest national statistics are detailed in Bulletin 27 and, as reported to the Committee previously, are remaining fairly constant. What may be of interest is that the number of cases referred for local investigation is now 44% of all allegations referred for investigation.

The final findings to date of the local investigations are:


"A clearer more enabling code"

After an informal introduction around the table Anne Rehill gave a presentation about Independent Members Fora and their experience. The Standards Board are in favour of establishing Independent Members Fora around the country. It is generally seen to support the independent members in their role and also promote consistency among all the different Standard Committees. It is noted that parish representatives do not have the same support and an inclusion of parish representatives could be considered. A proposal as to how often such a forum could meet and how their terms of reference could look was listed. Independent members were seen as of increasing importance and their numbers would probably increase in the standard Committees.

We had an around the table presentation of what we felt made our committees effective. It was quite clear that there were quite some differences in how the various Standard Committees worked, how successful their training of councillors had been etc. It was also clear that there was a vast difference in experience of members and any training they had received.

Few members had had experience with hearings but some of those who did had done it very differently from how we had organised it, but not better.

In the end most of us agreed that it had been a useful meeting. There was a general agreement that we should meet again in the autumn a morning or afternoon session. We were given the task to investigate if we (Northampton Borough) could host it next time around but exclude the lunch. There was a general agreement that we did not want to form any formal organisation or be part of a formal organisation. E-mail addresses were given to Denis Wilson.

RE-AFFIRMATION OF CODE OF CONDUCT

RECOMMENDATION(S)

 That the Committee considers the report and endorses the recommendation made in paragraph 3.2 of this report.

1. BACKGROUND

- 1.1 The Council's Code of Conduct (the Code) which sets out rules governing the behaviour of its members was formally adopted by the Council on 29 April 2002.
- 1.2 The Code is divided into 3 parts namely:

PART 1 – General Interests (Scope and Obligations)

PART 2 - Specific Interests (Personal Interests, Disclosure of Personal Interests, Prejudicial Interests, Overview & Scrutiny Committees, Participation in relation to disclosed interests)

- PART 3 Register of Members Interests (Registration of financial and other interests including Gifts and Hospitality)
- Following the adoption of the Code, all Members (including Parish Councillors) were bound by it and had to confirm in writing that they would observe the code and register their financial and other interests in the Council's Register with a further obligation that the register must also be updated within 28 days of becoming aware of any changes to the interests registered; this includes the registration of gifts and hospitality received.
- 1.4 Personal and Prejudicial interests are required to be declared at meetings of the Council and its Committees.
- 1.5 The written confirmation is effective for Members/Parish Councillors' term of office and will apply whenever Members/Parish Councillors are conducting business of their Council or office.

1.6 As you will be aware the Council is currently undergoing many changes and addressing many issues which includes ethical governance. To establish the profile of ethical governance and to also acknowledge its importance it is recommended that the Committee endorses paragraph 3 of this report as an appropriate way forward.

2. CURRENT POSITION

- 2.1 In April of each year Members receive a set of forms to re-register their financial and other interests pursuant to Section 81(1) of the Local Government Act 2000. Included with the forms is a reminder that any changes require registering within 28 days, this action thereby confirming adherence to Part 3 of the Code.
- 2.2 Parts 1 and 2 of the Code and the registration of Gifts and Hospitality pursuant to Part 3 are covered by Members/Parish Councillors' original written undertaking to be bound by the Code of Conduct.

3. CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATION

- 3.1 It is important from the Committee's perspective to maintain a profiled role in promoting confidence in standards of conduct by a dvising on, a ssisting with a nd monitoring the operation of the Code and encouraging Members to attend all training in this respect.
- 3.2 In the interests of propriety and to re-affirm the Members' commitment in maintaining high standards of conduct, it is proposed that the Committee recommends that Members/Parish Councillors be asked to confirm their observance of the Code by signing an annual Undertaking at the Annual Council Meeting to that effect (Parish Council Clerks to be advised in writing within same time frame). Accordingly it is proposed that the recommendations of this report be actioned at the next Annual Council Meeting.
