Pensioners' Forum News December 20

Welcome to the December 2010 edition of our newsletter. The purpose of this is to update you with news about the activities of the Forum, local services and opportunities. We hope that it will be of interest to everyone, although some of the content is specifically aimed at older people. Please note our next meeting is now on 27 January 2011: it includes NBC Budget Consultation and an update on changes the council wants to make to how community centres are run in Northampton.

News further to the Pensioners' Forum meeting on 16 December 2010

Royal and Derngate Theatres: update and ideas to help more older people use the theatres

Cllr David Perkins, trustee of the theatres and the Portfolio Holder for Finance, explained key differences between the two theatres: at The Royal Theatre work is produced and commissioned; at the Derngate work is 'bought in'. Both theatres are registered charities and receive funding from a number of sources. They have one of the lowest amount of subsidies of any regional not-for-profit theatre in the country.

Facts and Figures about the Royal and **Derngate:**

- Total economic contribution the Royal and Derngate theatres made to the region in 2009/10 was £21 million.
- The Royal and Derngate are the most commercially successful theatres outside of the West End.
- The average number of times a visitor attends the theatre per year is 1.42 times.
- 75% of the total income is received from non-grants-funded income streams.
- The theatres recently celebrated two wins in two categories at the Theatrical Management Association.

Concessions are available, including for Under 16s, people age 60+ and disabled people. Group discounts are available for groups of more than 10 people. At the Derngate, much of the money from tickets goes to the promoters of the shows. Sometimes promoters do not allow standby tickets to be sold and restrict the concessions allowed.

Members of the Forum gave feedback on their experiences of the theatres and ideas to help the theatres with their ambition of encouraging more people to use them more often.

As a result Cllr Perkins agreed to feedback to the other trustees:

- the idea for a 'pensioners' performance' where they would set the ticket price; and
- whether they have a 'mystery shopper' scheme in which older people may be able to volunteer and so get free access to productions across the theatres etc.

Keeping Warm in Winter

Last year it was estimated that over 25,000 people died in the UK as a result of illnesses linked to the cold weather. There are some things you can do to help keep warm this winter.

- Wear lots of layers rather than one chunky layer
- Eat at least one hot meal a day
- Have regular hot drinks and try to keep your energy levels up
- Keep your curtains closed and doors shut to keep the warmth in and the drafts out
- Try to keep the temperature above 18°C (65°F) in your bedroom overnight
- Put on a coats, hats, scarves, gloves and warm shoes or boots when you go outside
- Switch your electric blanket on before getting in to bed

Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places and 2011 Elections

The Boundary Commission has made some big changes to Northampton Borough Council ward boundaries. These new wards will be used for the May 2011 elections. Many of the polling stations will remain the same - they are large enough and accessible for disabled people. It's proposed to use some mobile polling stations as the only option where there are no alternative suitable premises available. The council would like to hear (by 4 Feb 2011) from people who have expertise in relation to access to premises or facilities for people with different types of disability - especially any suggestions for alternative places that may be used as polling stations.
