

# Agenda Item 1

#### Code of Conduct for the Forums

This Code of Conduct sets out the standards that the Forums expect of its members. It aims to provide members with an effective ethical framework in which to do business. It is not intended to be exhaustive, or to cover every eventuality, but sets out some common sense requirements to enable the forums to function smoothly and successfully.

It is the responsibility of the Chair to encourage and enable input from forum members, to ensure all voices are heard.

#### 1. Meeting Etiquette

As an attendee you must comply with the following requirements and any others that may be stated from time to time:

- 1.1 Contribute positively to discussions concerning the issues of the meeting
- 1.2 Be friendly, polite, courteous and respectful at all times to fellow members, and others present
- 1.3 Not insult, abuse or use offensive language or behaviour
- 1.4 Comply with Northampton Borough Councils Equal Opportunities Policy
- 1.5 Demonstrate actively that you are interested in and care about the issue that you are discussing and want to make a positive difference
- 1.6 Show respect for buildings, facilities and equipment being used
- 1.7 Speak only through the Chairman of the meeting and not interrupt, heckle, make distracting noises or gestures
- 1.8 Speak clearly into any microphone provided and comply with any instructions given about its use
- 2. Being Objective
- 2.1 Your own experience and views should inform, but not dominate or dictate how you participate.
- 2.2 If you have a specific issue with regards to a service matter to raise these can be discussed with a member of staff at the end of the each meeting or you can ask for the appropriate officer details. Meetings attended by other residents are not the place to raise any issues of this nature.
- 2.3 Be Fair
- 2.4 You must have and show respect for the people you deal with, and take their circumstances and personal differences into account. This is about putting equality into practice. The key is simply to respect differences fairly, so that you do not exclude anyone, or treat anyone inappropriately or unfairly because of their particular circumstances.

#### Breaching the Code of Conduct

If any person's behaviour breaches this Code of Conduct, they will be required to leave the meeting and vacate the premises where it is being held. They will not be permitted to attend future meetings unless they provide satisfactory evidence to Northampton Borough Council that they will comply with the Code – e.g. a letter of apology.

# 3. Introduction from Jeanette Pidgen, NHS Nene Clinical Commissioning Group (NHS Nene CCG)

Clinical Commissioning Groups are groups of GPs are responsible for designing local health services In England. They do this by commissioning or buying health and care services including:

- Elective hospital care
- Rehabilitation care
- Urgent and emergency care
- Most community health services
- Mental health and learning disability services

Clinical Commissioning Groups work with patients and healthcare professionals and in partnership with local communities and local authorities.

- Commissioning for Kettering General Hospital and Northampton General Hospital – to provide services
- Break down to NBC boundaries
- Corby has their own (NHS Corby CCG) but they do work together
- Joint Commissioning for adults to provide gateway to services
- There are 3 managers in all areas
- They are attending various forums to let people know about their services
- Looking to re-commission rather than decommission. They have a 5 year forward view and are currently working towards this.
- A representative will sit on all of NBC's forums and open dialogue to groups
- They are aiming to change services and move them closer to home. le.
  GP's, pharmacies and other clinical groups that is qualified.
- Northampton GP Alliance will commission with 3-4 commissioning groups.
- PPG (Patient Participation Group) each practice has a locality and engagement group
- They are holding an event in Central Library on the 20<sup>th</sup> April from 5.45pm 7.30pm. There will be market stalls including DWP, Sunset group, MH Collaborative etc.

#### **Question and Answers**

- Q. There is a lot of confusion with other well-being groups
- A. Will come under one roof. They work with the First for Well-being CIC

# The group discussed:

- The confusion with all the various wellbeing groups
- Who to refer people to and the difficulty in doing this
- Organisations who support people are finding it confused. The public are not interested in layers, they need a contact where they can be seen and be supported.
- It is important to know what the referral process is
- The public are not aware that the adult and children services are commissioned separately
- There are issues in referring young people to support. They are being sent away until they are more serious.
- Nationally 90 million has been given but has not filtered locally, although some has gone into schools

**ACTION:** Invite Rachel Conlon and David Lloyd Hearn to a future forum meeting.

- Q. What is a warm handover?
- A. Healthcare provider → provides services → person gets better Different levels of support as needs are not that great → patients' information does not get passed / or the service does not know their level of service required
  - Ambition → to have a clear hand over between services
- Q. There seems to be a lack of information being shared with people who actually work with the clients.
- A. Jeanette said that they are getting together with agencies to see what can be done about data being shared safely. NBC is leading on the Capita system. NCC has not joined this yet.
- Q. When are you going to join with the VCS
- A. They have done listening events which have included partners/groups
