Context

- Largest ever elections in Northampton
- 2 Parliamentary Constituencies
- 33 Borough Council wards
- 10 Parishes
- 45 Elections



Number of Ballots (roughly)

- 118,000 Parliamentary electors
- 142,000 Borough electors
- 27,600 postal voters
- 80% turnout = 208,000. 60% turnout = 156,000
- plus Parishes



Staffing Requirements

- Postal Vote Centre: 40
- Polling Stations and Poll Inspectors: 300 (approx)
- Counts: 250
- Core Team: 10
- Miscellaneous Others: 10

Verifications and Counts

- Verifications at Lings and Derngate ASAP after close of poll (General, 29 wards, 2 Parishes)
- 4 Borough wards and 8 Parishes in Northamptonshire South verified at Towcester
- Before 2am (hopefully) Friday 8th May General Election counts start
- Borough Count held over to 4pm Friday 8th May
- Parish Counts start 10am Monday 11th May
